

The Research Grants Council (RGC) Junior Research Fellow Scheme (JRFS)

- ◆ a key RGC initiative that supports promising postdoctoral talents at UGC-funded universities for a 24-month fellowship period
- ◆ seeks to nurture and attract outstanding young researchers for Hong Kong and incentivise them to build up a career in the field of research and development (R&D) in Hong Kong
- ◆ provides an annual stipend to cover awardee's basic salary as full-time Postdoctoral Fellow[#], with a conference and research-related travel allowance
- ◆ research support funding will be provided for JRFS awardees who subsequently advance to junior research academics[#], where applicable

What Makes It Special?

The JRFS[@] provides support to **60 awardees** annually for a period of **24 months** to conduct postdoctoral research on a full-time basis (as Postdoctoral Fellow (PdF)) **at a UGC-funded university**. The Scheme encompasses all academic disciplines grouped into two broad academic streams: **(i) Humanities, Social Sciences and Business Studies**; and **(ii) Sciences, Medicine, Engineering and Technology**.

For JRFS awardees appointed as PdF, they will receive via their supporting universities **an annual stipend to cover the basic salary as well as conference and research-related travel allowance***. For JRFS awardees who **have successfully completed the postdoctoral stage and subsequently become Assistant Professor or Research Assistant Professor at a UGC-funded university during the fellowship**, where applicable, they will receive, via their supporting universities, **research support funding^ until end of the fellowship period**.

Who Is Eligible?

All UGC-funded universities are eligible to make nomination for the fellowship in support of full-time employment of PdF for research project(s)/ activities[#].

To qualify for the fellowship, the JRFS nominee must:

- obtain a legal right to work and reside in Hong Kong during the fellowship period;
- have obtained/ been conferred a **PhD degree or an equivalent qualification** on or after 1 January 2022 (i.e. **not more than three years** before 2025), **or will complete the requirement of a PhD degree or an equivalent qualification** by 31 August 2026; and
- be supported by a UGC-funded university at which he / she wishes to hold the fellowship.

[@] *Formerly known as RGC Postdoctoral Fellowship Scheme (PDFS) which was launched in 2019. PDFS was renamed as JRFS with effect from the 2025/26 cohort with a widened scope.*

^{*} *The prevailing annual stipend is around HK\$425,000 (inclusive of the travel allowance at around HK\$13,500). The amount of the annual stipend will be suitably adjusted every 12 months and supporting universities will be informed of the updated rate.*

[^] *This funding is at HK\$140,000 per annum, and will be calculated pro-rata by month as applicable.*

[#] *Each university may nominate up to 15 PdF candidates.*

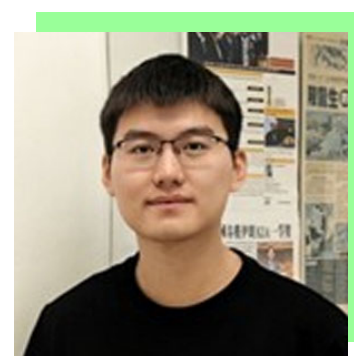
